

HUME FAQs

Are deposits refundable?

Deposits are nonrefundable. Deposits are transferable only until Wednesday, May 26, 2021. If you find your student will not be able to attend camp and you notify the Family Ministries Admin (not one of the pastors or interns) via email or in the Family Ministries office before 5 p.m. on Wednesday, May 26, you may transfer that deposit to a sibling or another trip in the 2021 calendar year. If you choose to cancel and do not notify the Family Ministries Admin before 5 p.m. on May 26, you forfeit your entire deposit and will not be allowed to transfer it to any other trip or person.

What if camp is cancelled due to Covid-19?

In the event Hume Lake cancels camp due to Covid-19, a full refund will be issued for all payments made.

What is Hume doing in response to Covid-19?

As we get closer to the start of camp in the months to come, Hume will keep us informed on the specifics of their COVID-19 related safety modifications and protocols designed to keep you and your students safe at camp. Hume's current [Covid Statement](#) is available on their website.

Who are the teachers/speakers?

He is on the vision-casting team, provides directional leadership for the church, and co-teaches a preaching course at Bethel Seminary. Chris loves bringing the Bible to life with his gifts as a communicator and storyteller, and has a passion for sharing his real and authentic journey with Jesus. Chris and his wife Amy have three children, two beautiful daughters, Sayla and Karis, and a crazy son named Barak.

Is there a subject theme for the week? What will the talks be about?

Exodus 34:6-8. At Hume this summer we will be looking at the character of God through the eyes of Moses, the man who spoke to God "face to face." Moses understood that God's love for His people cannot be separated from His holiness, nor His holiness from His justice, and that His sovereignty cannot be divorced from His goodness and eternity. Cultural relativism today often influences us to define God using our own imaginations; we create a god according to our image, rather than recognizing that God made us in His. But the one true God who "is the same yesterday, today, and forever" reveals to us the beauty of His character within His word.

Are scholarships available?

Yes! We want to do all we can to make camp accessible to students who want to attend. Calvary scholarship forms are due no later than May 26, 2021. You will receive an email from Hume mid-May with a link so you can complete their online enrollment / medical form and to apply for a scholarship from Hume. You must apply for a scholarship from Hume to be considered for a Calvary scholarship. Hume's scholarship deadline is June 6th.

How do the students get to Hume? Do we need to drive them?

We have charter busses that will take our group to camp. They are super nice, which helps the long ride go by faster!

How many kids in total are at Hume Lake for the week?

While Calvary is usually one of the larger groups, there will be other youth groups up at Hume with us. There are approximately 450 people at Meadow Ranch (Middle School) and 1000 people at Ponderosa (High School). In 2021, Calvary is taking 103 High School students and 75 Middle School students.

What is the cell phone/electronics policy?

There is no cell service at Hume Lake. We ask students not to bring cell phones to camp. It is ultimately up to the parent to decide if the student should bring a cell phone (to use as a camera, to check in on the bus ride home, etc). The responsibility will fall to the student for proper use and care.

How will my student be cared for in the event of a medical issue or emergency?

Hume has a great medical staff. They have their own medical station that offers quality care for minor medical needs and first aid. For more intensive care, we take students to a hospital in Fresno. In extreme cases people can be airlifted to the nearest medical center.

Do Middle School and High School groups interact during camp?

While both groups are in separate sections of Hume Lake, the groups will have times when they can interact (free time for example).

Are the Middle School grades all together? What about High School?

Regarding larger group gatherings, Hume has not informed us of what adjustments they are making to stay in line with state regulations. Middle School grades are typically together for chapel, meals, and recreation. The same goes for High School.

How are cabins divided?

Cabins are typically divided by grade and gender. Cabin assignments are not finalized until the week before camp and will not be posted.

What is the ratio of leaders to students?

Camp ratio is typically 1 leader for every 8-10 students.

Will I get more details about the week? What about a packing list?

As camp gets closer we will email more details and information including a packing list, available activities, additional costs, and Covid safety measures.
