Our Calling is to Shine

- Uncover the light in your life. Hebrews 12:1
 - Your life should be one that radiates the love of Christ.
- "Lampstand" yourself so that people may see the light in you.
 - O Just like Christ was lifted up to shed light on the world, we too ought to give light to the world and lead others to God.
- Glorify your Father in heaven.
 - o As the light of the world our goal is to glorify God the Father, not ourselves.

"Do all things without grumbling or disputing; so that you will prove yourselves to be blameless and innocent, children of God above reproach in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you appear as lights in the world" - Philippians 2:14-15
