New Hands: From Stealing to Sharing Ephesians 4:28

"He who steals must steal no longer; but rather he must labor, performing with his own hands what is good, so that he will have something to share with one who has need." Ephesians 4:28

Reject what destroys community: Hands that STEAL Ephesians 4:28

"He who steals must steal no longer..." (v.28)

Do not steal

"You shall not steal." (Exodus 20:15)

Hands that steal from people

- Our employers: Deuteronomy 25:13-16; Proverbs 11:1; Deuteronomy 24:14; James 5:4
- Our government: Romans 13:6-7, Matthew 22:15-22
- Our debt: Leviticus 19:13, Jeremiah 22:13
- Our employees: Ecclesiastes 9:10, Proverbs 13:4, Matthew 25:14-30
- O Hands that steal from God. Malachi 3:8-10, Acts 5:1-11

True repentance means to stop doing what is wrong, but also do what is right

"...and My people who are called by My name humble themselves and pray and seek My face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, will forgive their sin and will heal their land." (2 Chronicles 7:14)

A life free from stealing. Steal (κλέπτω (kleptō) "to steal")

Promote what builds community: Hands that SHARE Ephesians 4:28

"... but rather he must labor, performing with his own hands what is good <u>so that</u> he will have something to share with one who has need..." (v.28)

• The prerequisite for generosity is work

"I have coveted no one's silver or gold or clothes. You yourselves know that these hands ministered to my own needs and to the men who were with me. In everything I showed you that by working hard in this manner you must help the weak and remember the words of the Lord Jesus, that He Himself said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.'" (Acts 20:33-35)

The heart of a mom is to share

"For God is not unjust so as to forget your work and the love which you have shown toward His name, in having ministered and in still ministering to the saints." (Hebrews 6:10)

The target of our generosity

- O Share with family. 1 Timothy 5:8
- o Share with the poor. Galatians 2:10; 6:10; 1 John 3:17-18
- O Share with a church ministry. 2 Corinthians 8:1-6

Digging Deeper:

Many in the secular world get it. The outflow of our work does not have its end in simply acquiring more wealth, but the work leads to generosity. At some point "getting" runs its course and those who get are then led to give. This subversive upside-down kingdom that Jesus prescribed way back in His "Sermon on the Mount" (Matthew 5-7) is being lived out in the lives of some of the world's wealthiest billionaires. Individuals like Warren Buffet, Bill and Melinda Gates and Mark Zuckerberg are joining together in the "Giving Pledge" to give away at least half of their wealth during their lifetimes or through their will.

As we have looked in this passage from Ephesians today, the goal and purpose that God has for His people is not reached when they simply quit stealing. And the goal and purpose that God has for his people is not reached when they labor hard with their hands, even doing good in order to possess the money they earn. The goal of God for His people, in all their gainful employment, is reached when they work in order to have so that they can give to those in need. The thief is to become a philanthropist. The person who did wrong in order to meet his own selfish desires must now work in order to contribute to someone else's need.

This passage is part of a larger section from Ephesians 4:25-5:2. Some of this we have covered already and some is yet to come. The context for this section comes from Ephesians 4:17-24 where part of putting on the new self and laying aside the old self means that there needs to be movement from a negative behavior to a positive one, but also with appropriate motives.

LifeGroup Discussion:

- 1. As you look at the list above, where is your old self dominating? What negative behaviors do you need to take off and what positive behaviors do you need to put on?
- 2. Beyond just putting on the positive behaviors, Jesus asks us to take our devotion a step further by judging our motives. He goes after the Pharisees who observed the details of the Law and practiced righteous, though their hearts and motivation for practicing these behaviors was born out of selfish motives. Read this passage. "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you are like whitewashed tombs which on the outside appear beautiful, but inside they are full of dead men's bones and all uncleanness. 28 So you, too, outwardly appear righteous to men, but inwardly you are full of hypocrisy and lawlessness." (Matthew 23:27-28)

Where are you practicing the right behaviors with the wrong motivation?

3. **"For God is not unjust so as to forget your work and the love which you have shown toward His name, in having ministered and in still ministering to the saints." (Hebrews 6:10).** This Bible passage reminds us that even though others may not see or even forget our good work, God does not. Take a moment to surrender your need to be noticed and thanked by people, and ask to remind you of His love for you and His noticing of your effort. Who are the people in your life who you can encourage and remind that their good work has not gone unnoticed by you, or by the Lord? If appropriate, start with your mom.
