

I'm Holding, I'm Holding on to You Hebrews 3:1-6

Consider Jesus Hebrews 3:1

- The first command here is to "think carefully" about Jesus.
- Jesus will outlast your doubts, struggles, fears, questions and insecurities.

Jesus is more faithful Hebrews 3:2-6a

Hebrews 3:6a - "...but Christ was faithful as a Son over His house - whose house we are."

- Moses is the best example of faithfulness for Jewish believers.
 - o Moses was faithful as a servant for a testimony.
 - "Therapon" is the Greek word for servant in Hebrews 3:5 and is the only place it is used in the New Testament. Numbers 12:7 - "my servant is faithful in all my house."
 - Moses was faithful despite opposition from the people of Israel (Numbers 11:4-6) and from Aaron and Miriam (Numbers 12:1-2). But Moses wasn't perfect.
- The builder of the house has more honor than the house. We are the house. Jesus is the builder that is faithful and should be followed above all else.
 - 2 Timothy 2:13 "If we are faithless, He remains faithful."
 - Jesus expressed faithfulness in His actions, not just His words.

Hold on to Jesus Hebrews 3:6b

Hebrews 3:6b – "...if we hold fast our confidence and the boast of our hope firm until the end."

- The author is concerned about these believers who were facing real pressures to their faith, but genuine faith is tied to perseverance and confidence in Christ.
- Pray the Blessing over yourself and your family for the face of Jesus to protect you, shine upon you and be gracious to you, and give you peace.

THE BLESSING from Aaron's Benediction in Numbers 6:24-26

"The Lord bless you, and keep you; The Lord make His face shine on you, And be gracious to you; The Lord lift up His countenance on you, And give you peace."
