

# ELIJAH TO ELISHA 1 Kings 19 · 2 Kings 2

#### WHAT DOES IT TAKE TO PASS ON A VIBRANT FAITH TO THE NEXT GENERATION?

### A WILLINGNESS TO BE LED - ELISHA'S STORY (1 Kings 19)

He left the oxen and ran after Elijah and said, "Please let me kiss my father and my mother, then I will follow you." And he said to him, "Go back again, for what have I done to you?" So he returned from following him, and took the pair of oxen and sacrificed them and boiled their flesh with the implements of the oxen, and gave it to the people and they ate. Then he arose and followed Elijah and ministered to him.

#### WHAT DOES THIS LOOK LIKE?

## Following takes work

"So he departed from there and found Elisha...while he was plowing with twelve pairs of oxen before him, and he with the twelfth. And Elijah passed over to him and threw his mantle on him." (v.19)

#### Following takes sacrifice

"So he returned from following him, and took the pair of oxen and sacrificed them and boiled their flesh with the implements of the oxen, and gave it to the people and they ate. Then he arose and followed Elijah and ministered to him." (v.21)

## A WILLINGNESS TO LEAD - ELIJAH'S STORY (2 Kings 2)

And it came about when the Lord was about to take up Elijah by a whirlwind to heaven, that Elijah went with Elisha from Gilgal. (2 Kings 2:1)

#### WHAT DOES THIS LOOK LIKE?

#### Leading takes telling your story

Elijah said to Elisha, "Stay here please, for the Lord has sent me as far as Bethel." But Elisha said, "As the Lord lives and as you yourself live, I will not leave you." So they went down to Bethel. (v.2)

#### Leading takes investment

When they had crossed over, Elijah said to Elisha, "Ask what I shall do for you before I am taken from you." And Elisha said, "Please, let a double portion of your spirit be upon me." (v.9)

#### LOOKING TO THE NEXT GENERATION

As a parent, I want my children to live a greater life than I will live. I have dreams for them in their relationships with people and their relationship with God. One of the greatest responsibilities we have in this life is to pass on the torch of a vibrant faith in Jesus Christ to the next generation. Unfortunately, the message of the world encourages us to better ourselves and live for our own story. Elijah made an incredible investment in Elisha and it is evidenced by what Elisha went on to do through God's power.

Elijah had been Elisha's spiritual father and mentor (v. 12). Elisha mourned the departure of one of Israel's great spiritual warriors. By referring to Elijah as "the chariots of Israel and its horsemen" (v. 12; 13:14), Elisha probably meant that Elijah's prophetic powers and spiritual depth were the nation's true strength. He was a one-man army. The chariot was the mightiest weapon then known, and it was symbolic of God's supreme power. By asking, "Where is Elijah's God?" (v. 14), Elisha was calling out to God to demonstrate His power through him as He had done through Elijah. To the right is a list of the miracles documented in 2 Kings that God did through Elisha.
