

What's the Point of Pleasure? Ecclesiastes 2:1-11

Some will experiment in risky ways to find pleasure. Ecclesiastes 2:1-2

"I said to myself, 'Come now, I will test you with pleasure. So enjoy yourself.' And behold, it too was futility." (v. 1)

- Pleasure = to be joyful and glad in heart and mind.
- God is not opposed to "pleasure" which is found in the following:

o wine Psalm 104:15; Ecclesiastes 10:19

o ointment and perfume Proverbs 27:9

o a wise son *Proverbs 15:20; 10:1; 27:11*

a kind word
 meeting a loved one
 God's law
 the increase of the righteous
 God's feasts

Our Problem: We may find pleasure in the wrong places. Ecclesiastes 2:3-10

- Pleasure from sensual indulgence and frivolous activities. (v. 3) 1 Kings 11:1-6
 "I explored with my mind how to stimulate my body with wine..."
- Possessions we acquire. (v. 4-8) Proverbs 30:7-9; 1 Timothy 6:9-10 "I enlarged my works: I built houses for myself (v. 4)... Also I collected for myself silver and gold..." (v.8)
- Power and Prestige over others. (v. 9-10) Philippians 2:3-8 "Then I became great and increased more than all who preceded me in Jerusalem..." (v. 9)

God's Conclusion: Life becomes worthless when you find pleasure in all the wrong places.

Ecclesiastes 12:11

"Thus I considered all my activities which my hands had done and the labor which I had exerted, and behold all was vanity [worthless] and striving after wind and there was no profit under the sun."

Our Solution: Turn to God's truth to find pleasure and avoid a worthless life. Ecclesiastes 12:13

"The conclusion, when all has been heard, is: fear God and keep His commandments, because this applies to every person." (v.13)

Two examples of God's truth for pleasure seekers:

- Ecclesiastes 9:11 "I again saw under the sun that the race is not to the swift and the battle is not to the warriors, and neither is bread to the wise nor wealth to the discerning nor favor to men of ability; for time and chance overtake them all." Also see Psalm 49
- Jeremiah 9:23–24 "Thus says the LORD, 'Let not a wise man boast of his wisdom, and let not the mighty man boast of his might, let not a rich man boast of his riches; but let him who boasts boast of this, that he understands and knows Me, that I am the LORD who exercises lovingkindness, justice and righteousness on earth; for I delight [find pleasure] in these things,' declares the LORD.""

Digging Deeper + LifeGroup Discussion:

- 1. What in life gives you pleasure? Look at the list on the front of the outline under the first point. How many items in that list do you enjoy?
- 2. **Read Ecclesiastes 2** and note how many ways Solomon tried to find pleasure. How do you relate to his attempts at finding pleasure?
- 3. **Read Jeremiah 9:23-24.** What should you not boast about in your life? Reflect on why Jeremiah said not to boast about those areas. Did he say they are sinful? What should our perspective and hope should we have for life according to the last part of Jeremiah 9:24? How can you live that way?
