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What's the Point of Heaven? Ecclesiastes 3:11-22

God has set eternity in our hearts Ecclesiastes 3:11-13

Ecclesiastes 3:11 – *“He has made everything appropriate in its time. He has also set eternity in their heart...”*

God's work and will remains forever Ecclesiastes 3:14-15

Ecclesiastes 3:14 – *“I know that everything God does will remain forever; there is nothing to add to it and there is nothing to take from it, for God has so worked that men should fear Him.”*

- Ephesians 2:10

God will judge and declare eternal destiny for all humanity Ecclesiastes 3:16-22

Ecclesiastes 3:17 – *“God will judge both the righteous man and the wicked man, for a time for every matter and for every deed is there.”*

- Psalm 49:12; Romans 8:18-21; Revelation 21-22; John 17:3

- What will that eternal destiny include?

Response: Have you responded to Jesus' gift of eternal life with Him? On the back of this sheet, there is a model for a prayer you can say to Jesus asking Him to be both Lord and Savior of your life. Please use this as an example, but share your honest heart with Him today.

Digging Deeper + LifeGroup Discussion:

1. What has been your understanding of heaven and eternity? How has that changed at all today?
2. How does understanding the New Earth and New Jerusalem affect your feelings about eternity?
3. How can we turn our current city and world into more of a “garden city” that God wants to create one day?

Next Steps:

A PRAYER TO MAKE JESUS THE SAVIOR AND LORD OF YOUR LIFE: *“God, I know that I have sinned against you and I ask for your forgiveness. I believe that Jesus is Lord who came to live a perfect life, die as payment for my sins and rose from the dead to bring freedom, restoration and eternal life to all who believe. I do not have all the answers, but help me to learn from Christ as He leads and guides. From now on, help me to follow You daily, turn from my sin and live in step with Your Holy Spirit according to the Bible. May I find great pleasure and joy in serving You as I fully place my life in Your hands for the purpose of Your Kingdom and Glory. Amen.”*

Today’s Service:

GIVING: The offering is received each Sunday as a way to express trust in God and worship Him through giving.
